
The New Wave Story

Kathy and Steve Miller started New Wave Rafting Co. in 1980, with one raft, a station wagon and a dream. They were river runners and climbers, and both had worked as instructors for Outward Bound. In the winter they were ski instructors. Their love for rivers was based on early trips down the Colorado River in the Grand Canyon, along with raft and kayaking trips in Colorado and Utah.



The Millers were joined, in 1983, by Britt Runyon Huggins, now New Wave's Operations Manager.

Steve moved to New Mexico in 1976, to create and direct a wilderness therapy program for criminal offenders. It was through this program that Steve first organized raft trips on the Rio Grande. Following that, both Kathy and Steve worked for the Southwest Outward Bound School, located in Santa Fe, which, again, included raft expeditions on the Rio Grande. As it grew, New Wave became a family business. Kathy's kids - Laina and Brahm – grew up rafting and became guides. And the same for Steve's son Ethan.
